PURPOSE

The purpose is to protect lives and property in the Arizona Western College community through the use of College and community resources.

PROCEDURE

1. Definition
Civil disorder is defined as a sudden, unforeseen or foreseen emergency such as unlawful assembly resulting in riot, strike, and/or demonstration, and includes civil disobedience, sit-ins, stand-ins, mill-ins, etc. and obstruction to free access to buildings, walks, and/or roads.
2. Responsibility
 - 2.1 The College President and Vice President for Student Services or designated representative are responsible for coordinating the response to any civil disorder. Selected aspects may be delegated.
 - 2.2 The Vice President for Student Services or designated representative is responsible for making a personal inspection of the situation and reporting to the President.
 - 2.3 The Vice President for Student Services or designated representative, accompanied by a uniformed campus police officer, will issue a notice of unlawful assembly and a directive to desist and disperse to those involved.
3. The Role of Chief of Campus Police
 - 3.1 The Chief of Campus Police and/or police officers will be responsible for the restoration of order on the campus.
 - 3.2 If deemed necessary, the Chief of Campus Police or designated representative may request assistance from appropriate law enforcement agencies.
4. Information will be released to the public only by the President or designated representative.
5. The destruction of property will not be tolerated and appropriate law enforcement personnel will use appropriate force, as necessary, to prevent destruction of College or personal property.
