Friedman, Emmanuel Saez, Nicholas Turner and Danny Yagan. The data was collected from federal government sources covering all students from 1999-2013.The data reports estimates of both parents' (household) and children's (individual) income distributions by college for children who attended college between ages 19 and 22 in the early 2000s. Note that because of the ages selected these are the more "traditional" students that attend your college. The college each child attends was defined as the institution the child attended most frequently during four calendar years in which the child turned 19-22. The study calculated college-level values as means over students in the 1980, 1981 and 1982 birth cohorts.
