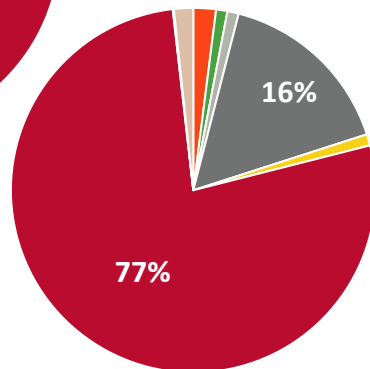
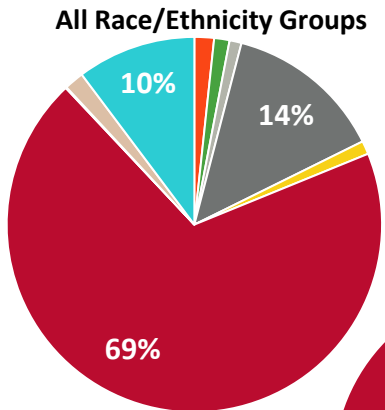

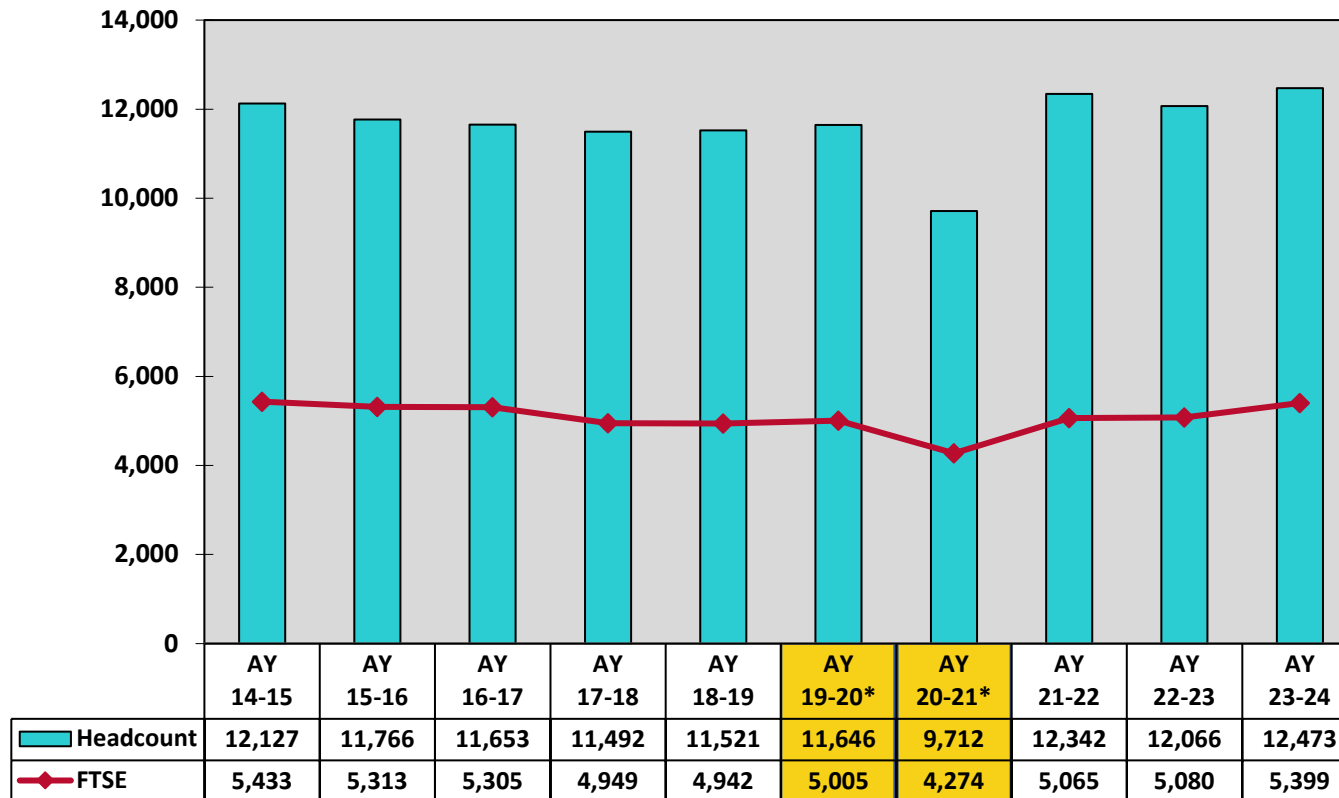

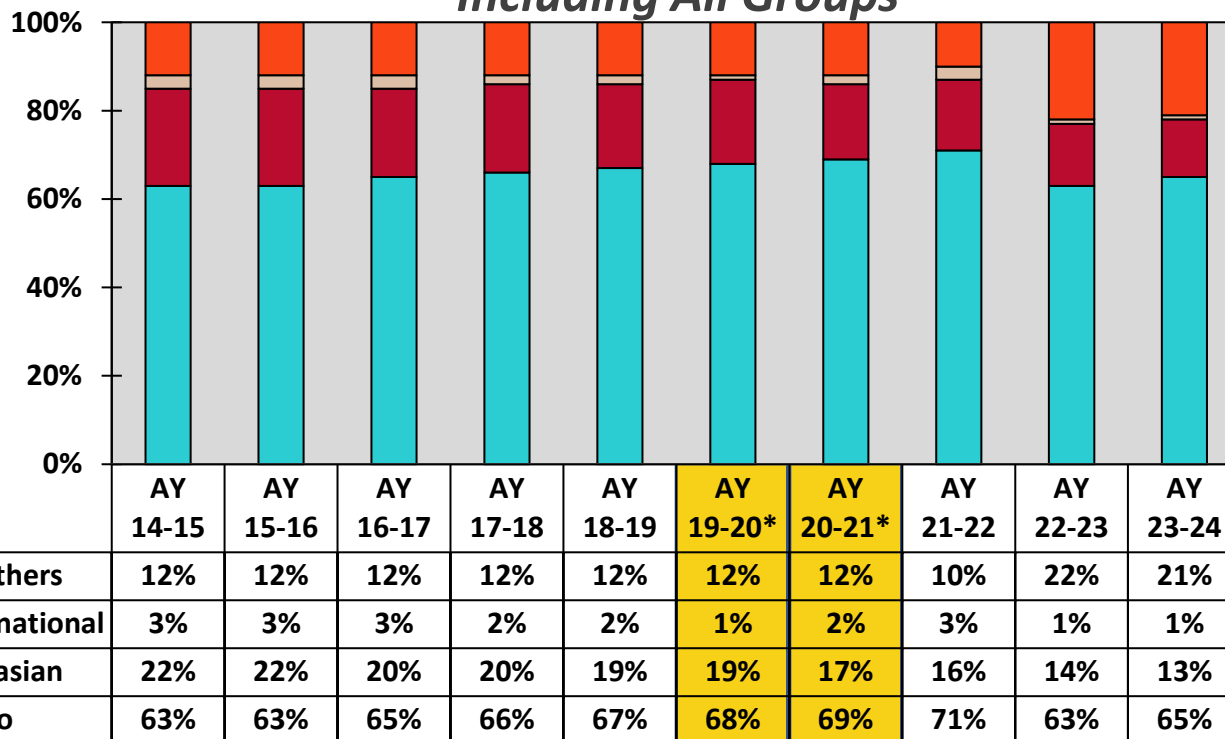

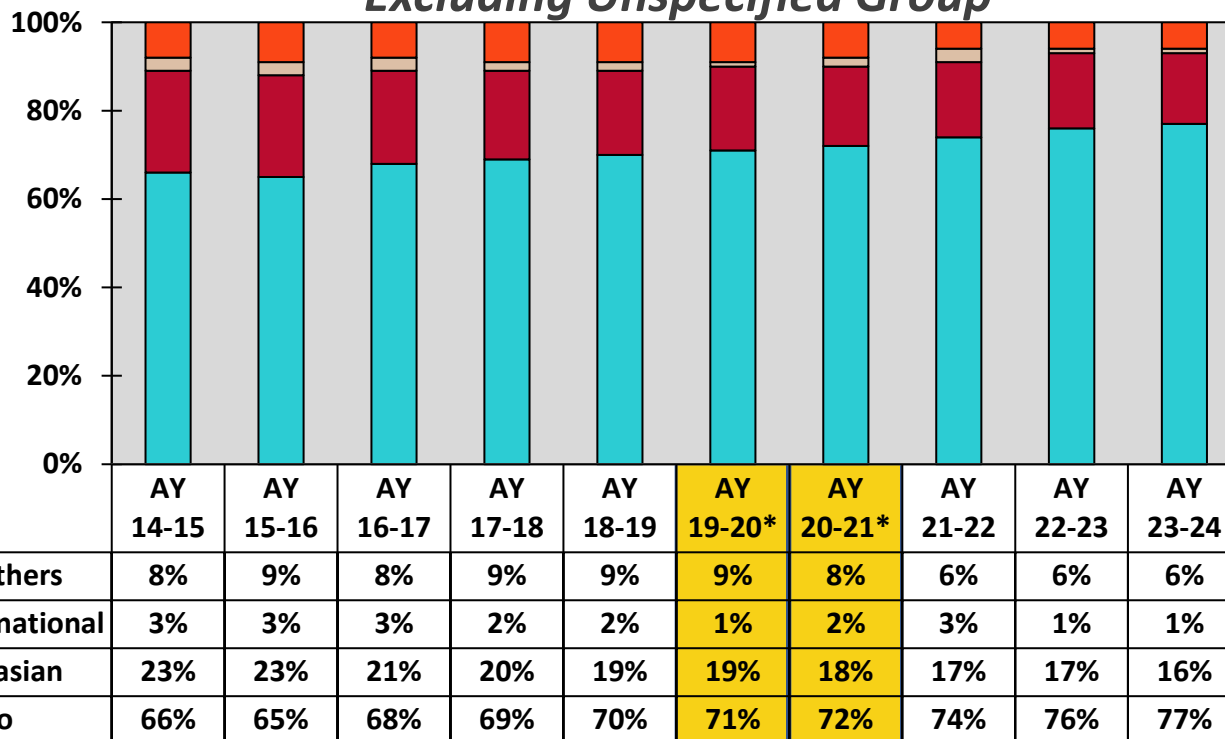
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10-Year Trend of Student Headcount by Race/Ethnicity

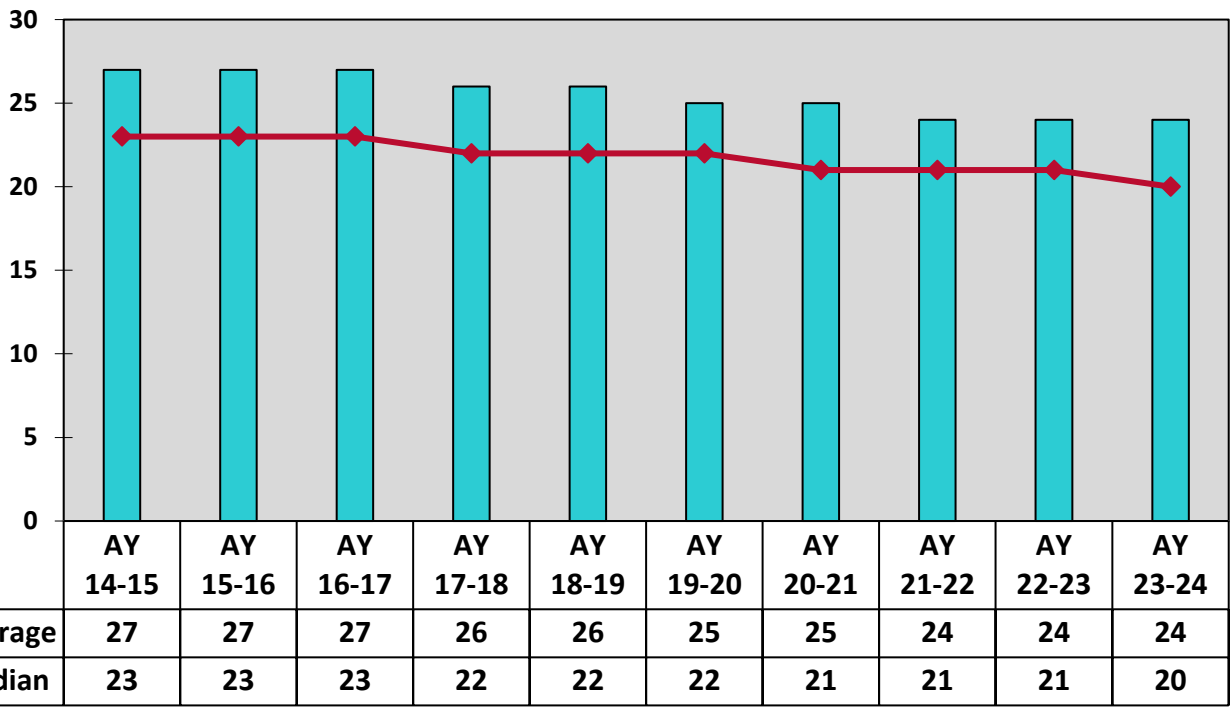

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10-Year Trend of Average & Median Student Age

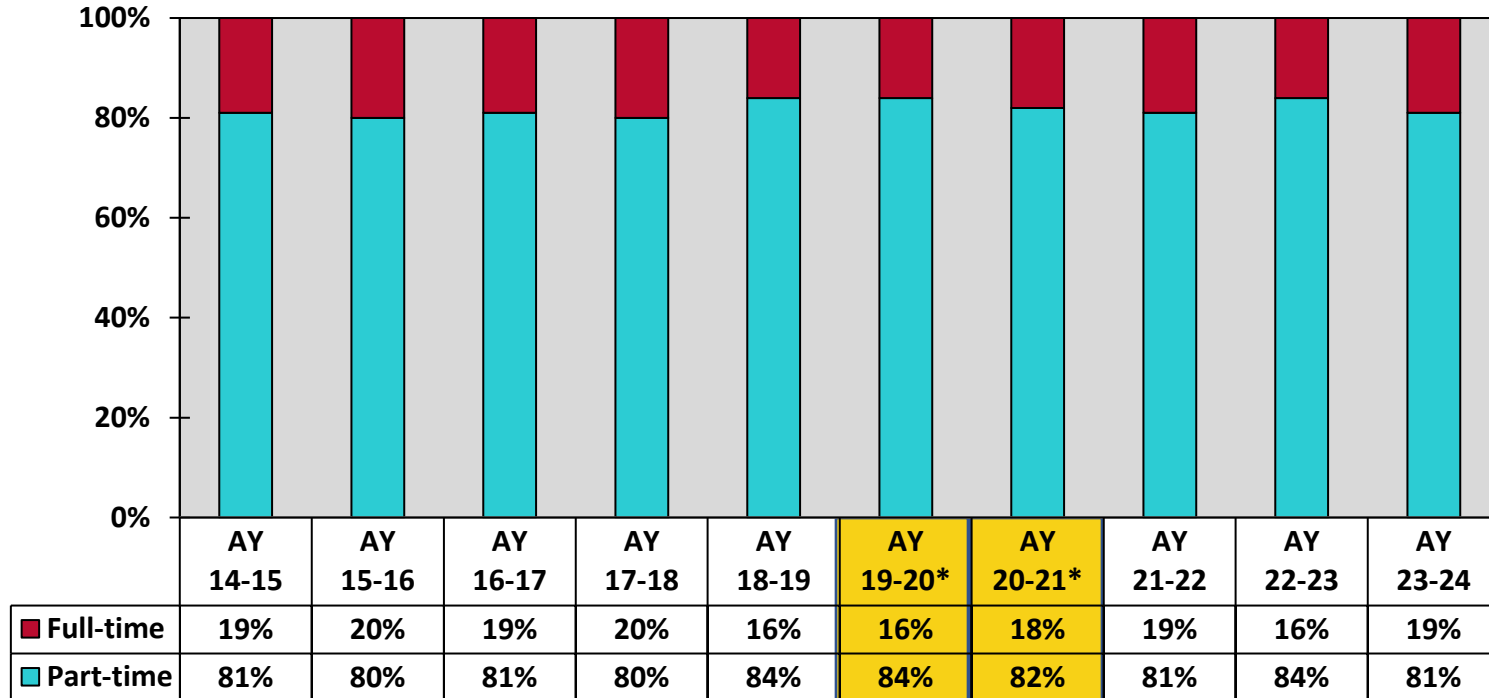

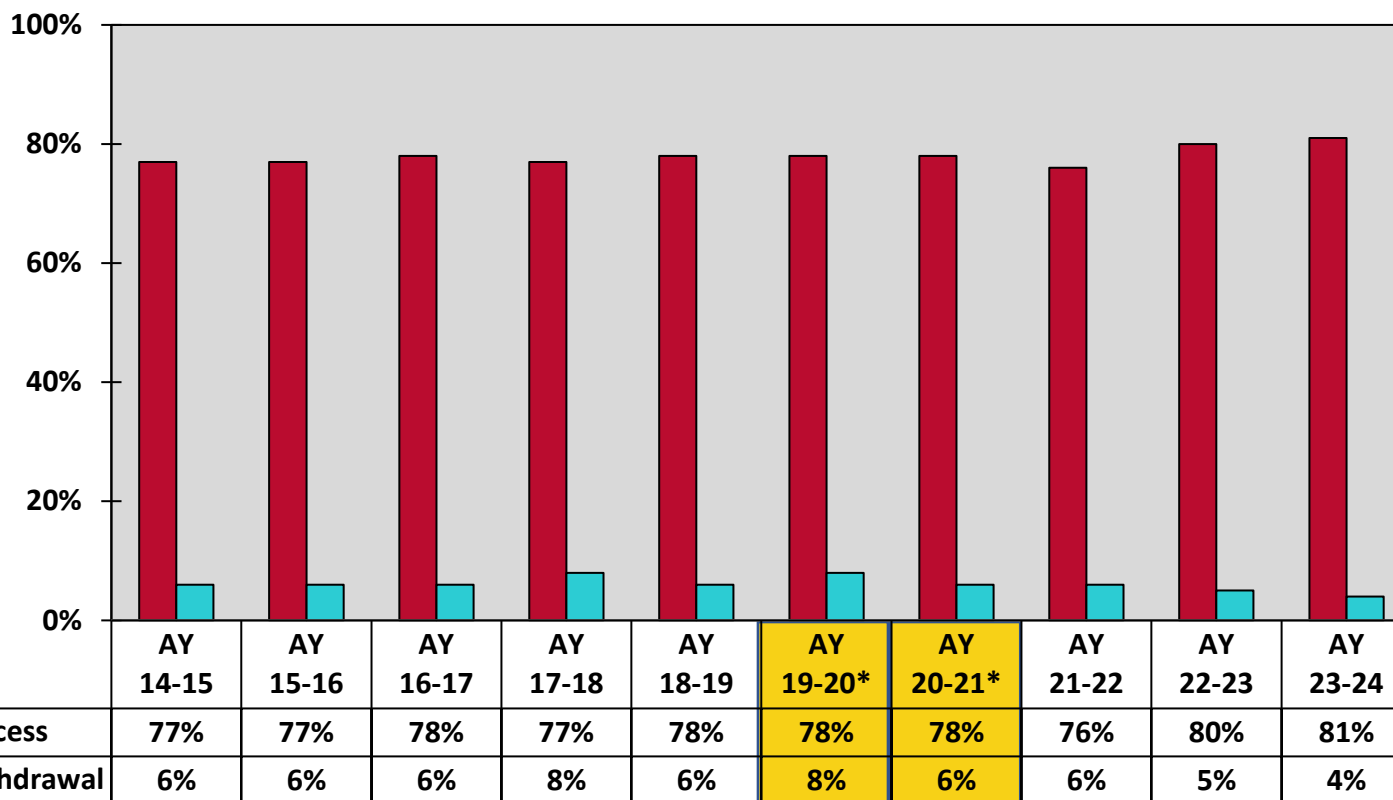
10-Year Trend of Student Headcount by Enrollment Status

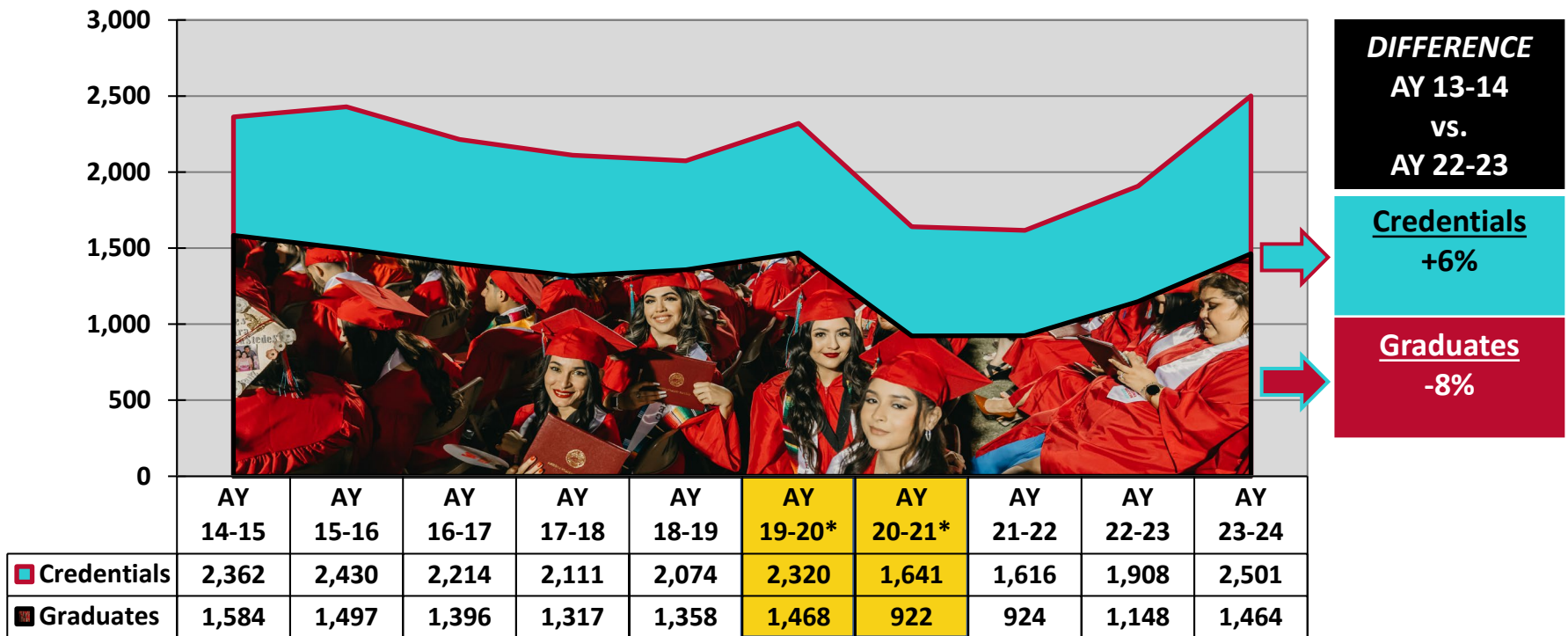

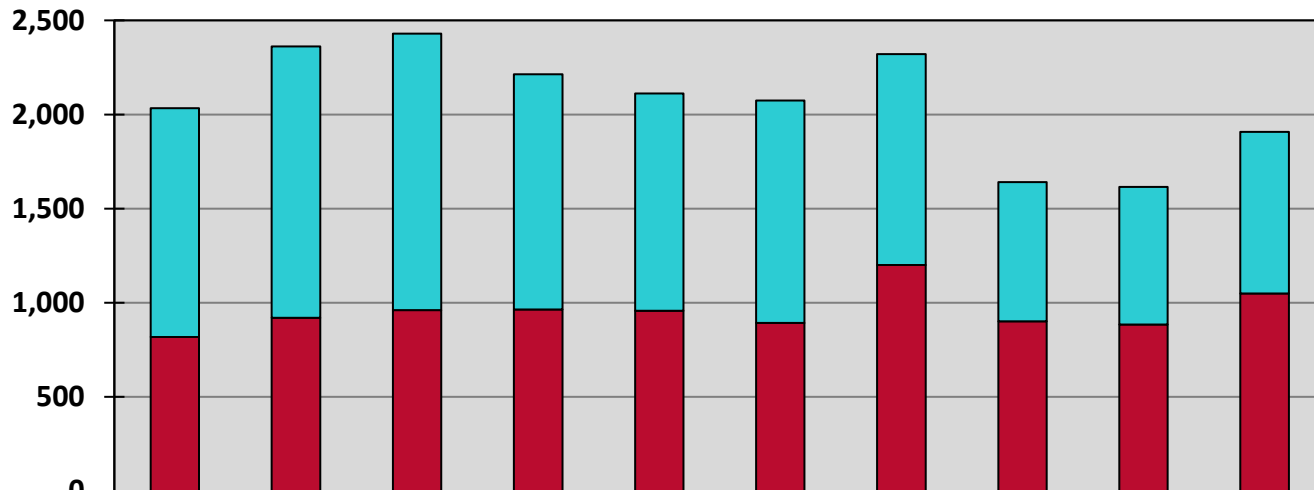


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10-Year Trend of Credentials, Degrees, & Certificates Awarded
