Board Meeting Workshop

Summary

The District Governing Board, workshop reviewed the progress of the college's Strategic Planning Process. The session, facilitated by Dr. Corr and Lori Stofft, Vice President of Advancement, included a brief update since the process began in March 2024. Stofft identified the nine themes that had been **identified through surveys, town halls, focus groups, and community events.**

Key Discussion Points: In a discussion led by Dr Corr, the Board emphasized the importance of language accessibility, ensuring support is available in multiple languages. There was strong interest in connecting education with business and economic success through Early College Pathways and the Entrepreneurial College, which offers flexibility, potential revenue, and enhanced fiscal stability. Expanding access to higher education remains a priority, particularly by innovative and expansive credentialing processes to allow more high school instructors to teach college-level courses and retain talent within the community.

Early College and AI: Early College programs were recognized as key to building awareness of higher education opportunities. The Board also discussed the integration of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in instruction and operations, acknowledging its potential while emphasizing the need for careful planning to maintain educational integrity and resource alignment.

In the end, there was strong and unanimous Board support to

- 1. Aggressively expand the Entrepreneurial College operations
- 2. Continue to differentially credential instructors to expand Early College opportunities
- 3. Implement AI to improve the student experience and increase efficiency
- 4. Establish a more flexible schedule (different modalities, semester starts, length of semesters, etc)

Strategic Planning Timeline: The planning process will continue in January 2025 with a draft plan, feedback collection, and refinement with Dr. Corr. The final plan will be presented to the Board in February 2025, with implementation immediately following under the leadership of Ashley Herrington. The plan will also guide budget preparation and funding priorities.

Community Responsiveness and Board Priorities: The Board underscored the college's commitment to responsive decision-making and fiscal planning to meet evolving community needs. Priorities include expanding flexible learning environments and schedules, embracing AI in multiple areas, and strengthening ties between education, business, and workforce development.






