COREQUISITES: PSY 101, and FAS/PSY 238

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Concepts of nursing care of (1) individuals with commonly occurring health care needs and (2) individuals and families experiencing child-bearing. Students will apply the nursing process in the care of individuals of all ages in defined settings.

1. COURSE GOAL

Apply the nursing process in the care of individuals of all ages in acute care settings, with a focus on health-illness integrating patient-centered care, teamwork and collaboration, evidence-based practice (EBP), quality improvement (QI), safety, informatics, and professionalism.

2. OUTCOMES

Upon satisfactory completion of this course, students will be able to:

- demonstrate patient-centered care with application of communication, nursing process, clinical judgment, and nursing skills, for clients and support systems in moderately structured situations (Patient-Centered Care).
- 2.2 demonstrate effective teamwork and collaborative skills through professional interactions with individuals, families, and the healthcare team (Teamwork and Collaboration).
- 2.3 demonstrate evidence-based practice in identifying clinical problems and developing appropriate nursing interventions to achieve positive patient outcome (EBP).
- 2.4 describe the process of quality improvement and the importance of measurement in providing quality nursing care (QI).
- 2.5 demonstrate factors that create a culture of safety within the context of the health care team (Safety).
- 2.6 utilize resource tools embedded in client care technology and information systems to support safe practice (Informatics).
- 2.7 demonstrate professional nursing behaviors in selected clinical settings (Professionalism).

6. STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES
