Take upper division courses during semester breaks while you complete your associate degree.







Estimate to complete BSN

Tuition

33 core credits x \$350 per credit hour = \$11,550

Resource fees

11 courses x \$170 = \$1,870

Estimated program cost

\$11,550 + \$1,870 = \$13,420 - \$1050 (5+1) \$12,370

Tuition Payment Options

Payment Options (1st & 2nd Semester)

- 1. CEP Tuition and Fees: First 4 courses: \$4,880 Students have the option to pay each course up front (\$1,220) or make 4 payments (\$305) per course.
- 2. BSN Tuition and Fees: Remaining 7 courses w/5+1 benefit: \$7,490 Payment options can include cash, financial aid, employer benefits, military, etc.

Payment Options (3rd Semester)

- 1. CEP Tuition and fees: First 2 courses: \$2,440 Students have the option to pay each course up front (\$1,220) or make 4 payments (\$305) per course.
- 2. BSN Tuition and fees: Remaining 9 courses w/ 5+1 benefit: \$9,930 Payment options can include cash, financial aid, employer benefits, military, etc.

Payment plans are interest-free, and students can set them up via the UOPX student portal under Financial Plan Management (FPM).
